SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

- The Scottish Sporting Car Club Limited will organise an Interclub permit Sprint on Saturday and Sunday 4/5th May 2024 at the Kames Motorsport Complex, Muirkirk, Ayrshire, KA18 3QQ (MR 71/696264).
- 2. The Meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising club may issue for the event.
- 3. Motorsport UK Permit Number: 135146
- 4. The event is open to members of clubs affiliated to the Scottish Association of Motor Sports Clubs and competitors registered in the championships listed in 5 below.
- 5. The event is a round of the following Championships:

Scottish Sprint Championship 2024 Permit No.CH2024/S062

Scottish Speed Championship 2024 Permit No.CH2024/S064 (Sunday only)

Lowland Speed Championship 2024 Permit No. CH2024/S030

Scottish Sporting Car Club Championship 2024.

- 6. The entry fee for the event is £105.00 per day (discounted to £100.00 per day for Scottish Sporting Car Club members). Competitors may enter either one, or both, days of the event. Entries should be made online using RallyScore (www.rallyscore.net). The appropriate fee(s) should be paid direct to the Club's bank account by electronic transfer. Entries open on the circulation of these Supplementary Regulations and will be accepted on a first come basis. Entries are only valid if payment is received.
 - If an entry needs to be withdrawn then the full entry fee will be refunded provided the Entry Secretary or the Secretary of the Meeting is notified before the closing date of Tuesday 30th April 2024. Thereafter refunds will be at the discretion of the Organisers.
- 7. Child Protection :- If the competitor is under 18, the Entry Form must include details of their parent or guardian. The Parent or guardian, or an appointed representative must be present throughout the competition. If a parent or guardian will not be present, a responsible adult representative must be appointed and must show written authority from the parent or guardian to act as the child's representative. A copy of that authority must also be emailed to the Entries Secretary. Copies of the Motorsport UK form for the appointment of an adult representative may be downloaded from the Motorsport UK website.

10. The maximum entry for the meeting is 70. The minimum is 40. The minimum for each class is 4. Should any of the above minimum figures not be reached, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the event or amalgamate classes as necessary. Entries will be selected on a first come, first served basis. A maximum of 10 reserve entries will be accepted per day. If any reserve entry does not get a start, their entry fee will be returned in full.

- 12.Competitors must produce a valid club membership card (or digital equivalent) and Motorsport UK competition licence when signing-on.
- 13. If requested by the scrutineer, competitors in Division A, S and Class D1, must produce hard copies of the MoT (if applicable), valid insurance certificate and proof that the vehicle is currently taxed. Competitors in Divisions B, C and D (excluding Class D1) must produce their Vehicle Passport/Competitors Car Log Book if requested.
- 14. The event will consist of the following Divisions and Classes:

DIVISION S - STANDARD CARS

Class S1 For drivers aged 14-16 in cars of not more than 110BHP in a Standard Road Car

DIVISION A - ROAD CARS

Class A1 Saloon Cars up to 1400cc

Class A2 Saloon Cars over 1400cc and up to 2000cc

Class A3 Saloon Cars over 2000cc

Class A4 Sports Cars up to 1400cc

Class A5 Sports Cars over 1400cc and up to 1700cc

Class A6 Sports Cars over 1700cc

Class A7 Not used – see Division D below

Class A8 Marque Road Sports Cars

Class A9 Scottish MX5 Hillclimb and Sprint Register Cars

DIVISION B - MODIFIED CARS

Class B1 Modified Saloon Cars up to 1400cc

Class B2 Modified Saloon Cars over 1400cc and up to 2000cc

Class B3 Modified Saloon Cars over 2000cc

Class B4 Modified Sports Cars up to 1400cc

Class B5 Modified Sports Cars over 1400cc and up to 1700cc

DIVISION C - COMPETITION CARS

15.All competitors and vehicles must comply with Motorsport UK Common Regulations for Competitors and Specific Regulations for Sprints as set out in the current Motorsport UK 2024 Yearbook sections H to L and S, and the 2024 Scottish Sprint Championship regulations or the 2024 Lowland Speed Championship regulations.

- 16.Competitors will be identified by competition numbers, which must comply with Motorsport UK regulation S.9.2.5. Competitors must supply their own numbers. Competitors are reminded that competition numbers must be covered or removed whilst driving on the public highway (S.9.2.6)
- 17. The length of the course on Saturday is around 2,400 yards and consists of approximately 3 clockwise laps of the circuit.

The length of the course on Sunday is around 2,200 yards and consists of approximately 2³/₄ anticlockwise laps of the circuit.

- 18. Competitors may walk the course prior to commencement of practice, under official control.
- 19. Tyre warming will NOT be permitted.

Please note the use of single use plastic to protect tyres in the paddock or on the way to the start line has been banned .

- 20. Time permitting, and at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, competitors will be offered a minimum of one practice run and a minimum of three timed runs.
- 21.Starting order will be in class order. Cars will start singly. The starting signal will be a green light. Method of timing will be electronic with light beam operated switching. A timing strut in accordance with S.10.10 is required. The finish line will be indicated by the display of a chequered flag.
- 22.In the event of an incident, RED FLAGS will be used to halt racing, as described in S.4 and S.9.3.7(b) of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook. When red flags have been deployed, entitlement to a re-run will be subject to S.9.5.8 of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook, and at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
- 23.Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after all class runs have been completed on each day. Any appeal must be lodged in accordance with C.6.1 to 6.4 of the current Motorsport UK Yearbook.
- 24.All other General Regulations of Motorsport UK will apply as written, except for the following which are modified:.
 - D.17.1 Two entries for the same vehicle are permitted
 - S.9.2.3 A driver may only drive a maximum of two cars.
 - S10.6.4 Hybrid and electric cars are not allowed.
- 25. Awards will presented as follows:

Competitor recording the lowest aggregate fastest time on the Saturday and the Sunday – Bo'ness Trophy and Replica

Fastest Time of Day (Saturday) – Perpetual Award

Fastest Time of Day (Sunday) - Perpetual Award

Competitors achieving FTD will not be eligible for a class award on that day.

First in Class (minimum of 4 in class) - Perpetual Award. If there are 6 or more in class a 2nd in Class award will be presented.

All the awards will be presented as soon as possible after the results are finalised at the end of each day.
